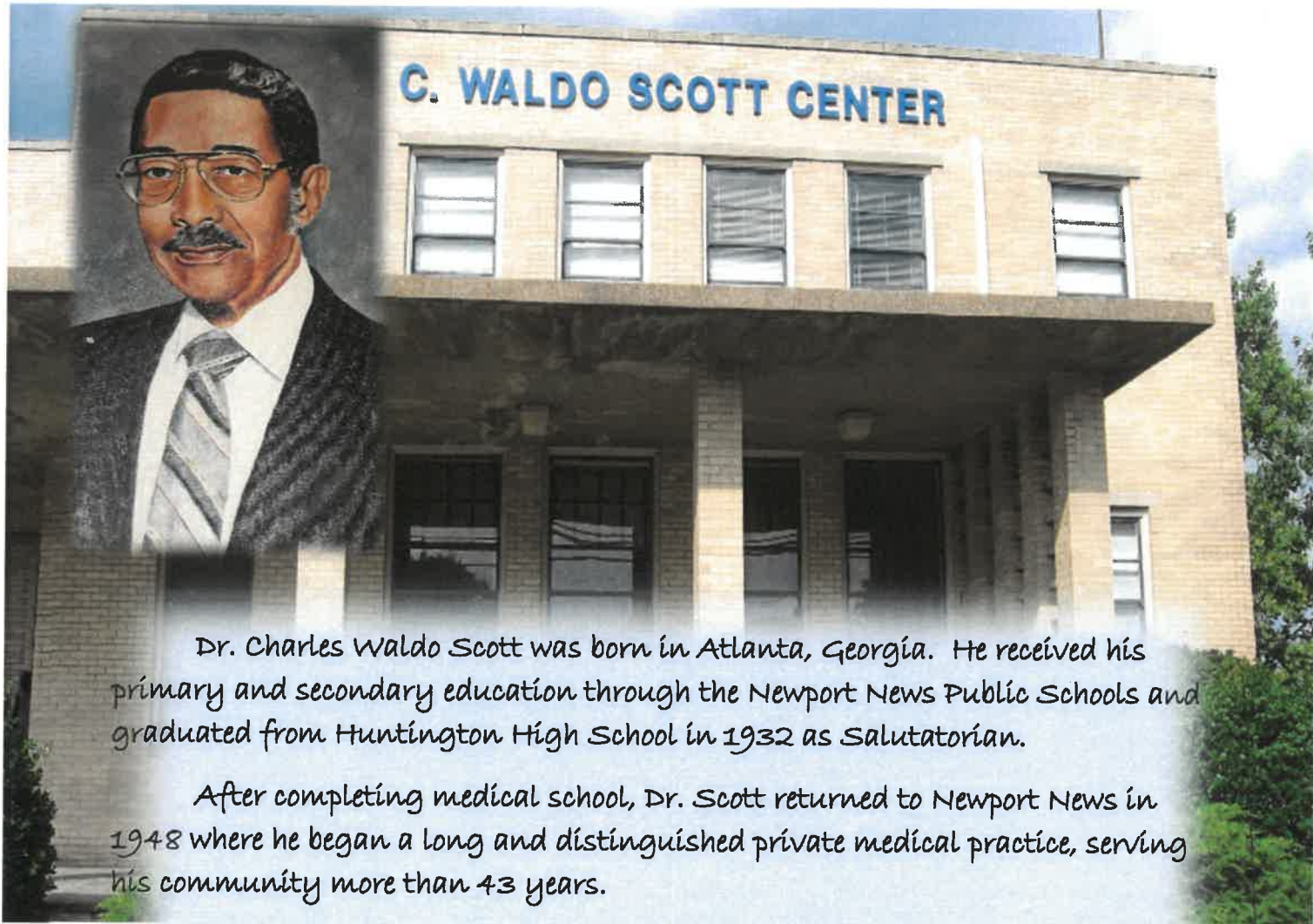

Dr. Charles Waldo Scott, M.D.  
April 22, 1916-January 9, 1993



Dr. Charles Waldo Scott was born in Atlanta, Georgia. He received his primary and secondary education through the Newport News Public Schools and graduated from Huntington High School in 1932 as Salutatorian.

After completing medical school, Dr. Scott returned to Newport News in 1948 where he began a long and distinguished private medical practice, serving his community more than 43 years.

Dr. Scott was also known in his community for advocacy and work for civil rights. He had a passion for the improvement of educational opportunities and served as the first black member of the Newport News School Board.

Dr. Scott was a committed husband to the late Mrs. Mae Hamlin Scott and father to their children, Charles Waldo Scott, Jr. (deceased), Robert C. Scott, Dr. Jon Scott, and Valerie Scott Price.

The C. Waldo Scott Center for H.O.P.E. was named in honor of Dr. Charles Waldo Scott in 1993. On June 25, 2010, the Scott Center was the site of a historical event. The City of Newport News unveiled a historical marker in honor of Dr. Charles Waldo Scott.
